

## 2009 Camper Fees

Due to State of Illinois law changes in the minimum wage, we, along with all other camping facilities in Illinois had to increase our fees to meet the demands of this new law. We have worked very hard to keep the increase as minimal as possible. The new camper fee for 2009 has gone up to \$195 per camper. The adult rate has gone up to \$70.

## Additional Program Fees

## Refunds

If a Boy Scout registered for Camp Bunn finds that he cannot attend, he can receive a full refund minus the \$25 deposit only if he has a personal emergency. A request **MUST** be made in writing to the Council Camping Committee no later than two weeks after the beginning of your unit's scheduled camp week. The refund may be prorated to cover food and program expenses incurred on the Scout's behalf. The final authority is the Council Camping Committee, which meets once a month.

## Provisional Troop Camping

Occasionally Scouts are unable to attend camp the week that their troop has chosen. For this reason, a provisional troop program is available during week 3, July 5-11, at a cost of \$195.00 per provisional camper. The Scout must submit a completed application, which he can obtain from his Scoutmaster or the Council Service Center, to the Council Service Center. See the fee schedule on page 4 for details on discounted fees. Once the application is received in the office, the Scout will receive a camp guide.

## Senior Patrol Leader "Free Week"

This program allows your Senior Patrol Leader (or acting Senior Patrol Leader) to attend a "free week" of camp, so that he can earn merit badges and participate in all camp activities and fulfill all the responsibilities of a Senior Patrol Leader during your troop's paid week in camp. Just let us know which session he'll be attending as his "Free Week". If you are willing to host a senior patrol leader, please let us know that as well.

## Trading Post

The Trading Post has always been a popular place for campers, staff, and visitors. It is well stocked with T-shirts, mugs, and souvenirs as well as program items such as merit badge books, craft items, and camping needs. The Trading Post also sells a variety of snack items. (Scouts typically spend around \$30.00 a week in the Trading Post). Debit cards are available for purchase in \$5 or \$10 amounts. Hours will be posted on the bulletin board outside the Trading Post.

## Lost And Found

The camp lost and found box will be located in the Administration Building. Please remind each Scout to **mark** his personal effects and to remember to take care of and safeguard his property.

## Health and Medical Records

A health history revised within the past 12 months and a physical examination conducted within the past 36 months are required of each youth camper and adult under 40 years of age. A copy of the physical form must be attached to each health history. Every year a parent or guardian must sign and attest to the validity of the health history and physical examination for each of those under 18 years of age. Adults 40 years of age and over are required to show evidence of physical examination within the past 12 months.



Upon arrival, each Scout and Scouter under 40 years old will need to turn in a completed "Personal Health and Medical Record (No. 34414A) available at your BSA office or the equivalent Abraham Lincoln Council Health Form, which can be found on the council website ([alincolnbsa.org](http://alincolnbsa.org)). A sports physical will be accepted **if it is accompanied by an updated medical history with the parent authorization to treat dated within the last 12 months**. Adult leaders over the age of 40 must have an annual physical exam and use form No. 34412B (Class III). **Any Scout or Scouter that arrives late or only stays for part of the camp week (24 hours or more) must also turn in a Health & Medical Record Form to the Camp Health Officer.** *It is helpful for each troop to have a notebook with all physical forms alphabetically filed in plastic sleeves.*

**Any food allergies or other food related issues, such as vegetarianism, must be sent in a letter to the Camp Director and Commissary Supervisor before the week of camp. Our Commissary Supervisor will be available to meet with scouts, their parents, or leaders regarding any food concerns.**

## Health Lodge and Emergencies

The camp Health Officer handles camp injuries and sicknesses. If medical care is needed, the Scout will be taken to Carlinville Hospital for treatment, **with the assistance of the troop leadership**. Each troop should provide first aid supplies for use in the campsite. All first aid treatment must be reported to the Health Officer. Health Lodge hours for non-emergency treatment are: 9:00-9:30a.m., 1:00-1:30 p.m. and 7:00-8:30 p.m. The camp physician, who has an office in Litchfield, will see non-emergency illnesses during his regular office hours.

## Camp Tours

If this is your first experience at Camp Bunn, a camp exploration tour led by your camp guide will be held on Sunday. This tour will familiarize you and your troop with the layout of Camp Bunn and the location of program areas.



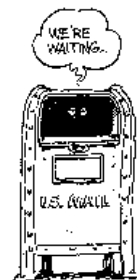
## Telephone

The camp telephone is for business and emergency use only. Any outgoing calls by leaders or Scouts must be collect or by credit card and made on the pay phone outside the Administration Building. ## Release of Campers

For the safety of our youth, campers may only be released to an authorized person as listed on the "Camper Release Authorization Form" held on file in the Camp Office. The form must be completed and turned in with the camper's Health & Medical Record at the time of check-in. Only the camper's parent or legal guardian may complete and sign this form.

**Each camper leaving camp shall notify his Unit Leader and the Camp Office as to the estimated time of departure. The camper shall wait at the Administration Building for the appropriate adult providing transportation to arrive.**

When the adult arrives, the camp administration will verify the name on the "Camper Release Authorization Form" and ask to see a photo identification card (i.e. – Driver's License, State Identification Card, Military Identification Card, etc.) After the verification of the name on the form to the picture ID, the adult shall sign out the camper.
